Way back in 2011, Prithvi started its journey by organising art camps and then artists' exchange programmes, especially with Greece in 2014/2015. Prithvi also organised a Spring festival of three days in 2014 in collaboration with Alliance Francse de Delhi.

Prithvi supports young art students to pursue fine art education. It has produced 17 documentary films till date and is a publishing house as well.

It has also created a resource centre with an exhibition gallery, creative spaces for book launches, readings and discussions and an artist residency to exchange cultures of the world.

The centre opened its heart and doors to the people of Delhi as well as to the universe with a solo exhibition of paintings by Sangeeta Gupta, an abstract artist from Delhi, on July 14, 2018.

Prithvi does collaborations with like-minded people and institutions. It offers gallery for exhibitions on rent and space for artist residency with basic yet state-of-the-art amenities and a studio for creative work.



Dr. Anjolie Ela Menon

Dr. Anjolie Ela Menon was born in Asansol, West Bengal in 1940. She is among India's iconic contemporary artists. She is well known for her finely wrought oil paintings, her window series, her work with painted objects, computer enabled imagery and glass sculpture. After a spell in JJ School of Art and a degree from Delhi University she studied Fresco at the Ecole Des Beaux Arts in Paris on a French Government Scholarship. Menon has held 55 solo exhibitions including retrospectives at the National Gallery of Modern Art, Mumbai and at the Lalit Kala Akademi. Her work hangs in major museum and private collections globally. Three books and many films have been made on her life and work. She has done several murals in public spaces including one in fibre glass in Esplanade Station Kolkata. The Asian Art Museum San Francisco accessioned her seminal work titled Yatra, after a six month solo – the only Indian painter to be thus honoured. She was awarded the prestigious Padmashree by the Government of India and the Chevalier des Arts et des Letteres by the French Government and the Life Time Achievement Award of the Delhi Government in recognition for her contribution to Indian art. She has been conferred the degree of Doctor of Letters by Rabindra Bharati University.



Recipient of the Rajiv Gandhi Excellence Award for the Best Contemporary Artist of the Year, 2014.


Honored with Indian Council for UN Relations Award in the field of Fine Arts, 2015.

Rachna Parasher

Rachna Parasher's journey in pottery started in at Delhi Blue Pottery in 1984 under Mini Singh. In 1985 she moved on to Golden Bridge Pottery in Pondicherry where she learned advanced techniques of throwing, salt glaze firing and kiln building under Ray Meekar. In 1987 she joined Lalit Kala Academy's Garhi Studios in Delhi as a practicing artist and spent seven years there. In 1993 she started her own studio in Noida where she now works and teaches. Her teaching includes throwing techniques and an elaborate structured course in glaze formulations and development.

For her work on glaze development, in 2002, Rachna was given a senior fellowship by the Ministry of Culture. In the past two decades she has won several awards and participated in many group and solo shows.

35 solo exhibitions, 25 books, 10 books translated in other languages, 17 documentary films and still counting.

Her tryst with art is born of her own meditative ruminations in time, the undulating blend of calligraphic and sculptonic entities are all realms that she has explored with aplomb. Images in abstraction that harkens the memory of Himalayan journeys and inspirations, the works speak of an artistic sojourn that continues in a mood of ruminations and reflections over the passage of time.

Sangeeta wields the brush with finesse, suggesting the viscosity of ink, the glossiness of lacquer, the mist of heights, the glow of the sun, and the inherent palette of rocks when wet. The canvases bespeak surfaces akin to skin, bark and the earth.

Her first solo exhibition was at the Birla Academy of Art & Culture, Kolkata in 1995 which was inaugurated by Mother Teresa and the entire sale proceeds were donated to CRY (child relief and you) to make an educational centre for poor children in the suburbs of Kolkata.

Her 35solo shows have been held all over India i.e. Delhi, Mumbai, Kolkata, Bangalore, Hyderabad, Lucknow, Chandigarh and abroad at London, Berlin, Munich, Lahore, Belfast, Thessolinki, Mississauga, Toronto, Canada.

Her one show was inaugurated by the former President of India; Dr. A.P.J Abdul Kalam in August, 2013. Which was dedicated to Uttarakhand, fund raised through sale proceeds of the paintings is used for creating a Fine Art Education grant for the students of Uttarakhand.

She has participated in more than 200 group shows in India & abroad, in national exhibitions of Lalit Kala Akademi, All India Fine Arts & Craft Society and Sahitya Kala Parishad and in several art camps.

Her painting are in the permanent collection of Bharat Bhavan Museum, Bhopal and museums in Belgium and Thessolinki. Her works have been represented in India Art Fairs, New Delhi several times.

She has received 69th annual award for drawing in 1998 and 77th annual award for painting in 2005 by AIFACS, New Delhi and was also conferred Hindprabha award for Indian Women Achievers by Uttar Pradesh Mahila Manch in 1999, Udbhav Shikhar Samman 2012 by Udbhav for her achievements in the field of art and literature and was awarded "Vishwa Hindi Pracheta Alankaran" 2013 by Uttar Pradesh Hindi Saahitya Sammelan & Utkarsh Academy, Kanpur. She was bestowed with Women Achievers Award from Indian Council for UN relations on the eve of International Women's Day in March, 2013 and many more after that.

There is a collection of short stories and 15 anthologies of poems in Hindi to her credit. Her poems are translated in many languages ie in German, Greek, English Bangla, Dogri, Tamil and Urdu. Her book Lekhak ka Samay 2006, is a compilation of interviews of eminent women writers in Hindi.

En Dino, Nadi Ko Naav Me Bhar, Mussavir Ka Khayal, Roshani Ka Safar, Parinaad, and Iss Paar Uss Paar are her book of poems and drawings/paintings/ photographs.

Lal Butti Ke Bachhe, Beej Sirf Zamin Par Ugate Hain and Ek Khawab Aasma Hua Jata Hai are some of her notable collection of Hindi poems.

Weaves Of Time, Ekam, Song Of Silence, Ends Are Beginnings, Rise From Your Ashes and Hymn To Trees are her 6 collection of poems in English.

Song Of The Cosmos is her creative biography.

She has directed, scripted and shot 17 documentary films, 7 of them are in the collection of Library of Congress, US.


She lives and works in Delhi, India.






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

Vimmi Indra

Vimmi Indra completed her Bachelor in Fine Arts (BFA) from Government Institute of Fine Arts, Jabalpur. Her journey of growing up in the smallest corners of Bihar and later moving to the big world of cities is reflected in her lucid dream-like artwork. Her paintings are a fantasy world where figures float against an ever-changing environment of our cities, buildings and nature. Her canvases pulsate with an inner rhythm and energy, glowing like jewels with colours and expressive

figures. The vibrant palette and use of soft brush technique speak of a mature handling of the medium. While her earlier paintings were a union of imagination and reality in her cityscape series, her new works appear like a lucid dream with simple expressive figures. The viewer is transported into a parallel universe as he sees his visions of a lost world taking a pictorial form. Her art practice employs simple yet meditative approach, no ornamentation yet enigmatically beautiful, limited colour palette yet it offers an intriguing possibility to the interpretation of diverse art lovers. Her work is a manifestation of her daily encounter with the life in discordant social order, complexities of social intercourse & her amicable yet mute response that forms a launching pad for her art practice which seemingly is an attempt to engage with the society.

Vimmi's artworks have received recognition from the Hon'ble President of India as a part of an artists in residence camp held in the premises of Rashtrapati Bhawan. Her work now is a part of the Hon'ble President's art collection. Vimmi has held several solo and group art shows in India and abroad. She regularly contributes to charity and auction shows looking for ways to give back to the society through her artwork. She has also curated multiple art-exhibitions and camps while promoting emerging artists.


