I am a resident of the village area. I have an emotional attachment to rural culture and society. I have seen the simplicity, beauty and problems of rural lifestyle and what I have seen experienced. I present through the art work. My painting is my life journey which presents the rural lifestyle. As a medium I use old Katha fabric as a canvas which I get from the nearby village house. Katha is made by hand in women in the village with the help of needle thread, if said, it is also a part of our culture. My Katha (fabric) is old, worn out, Rough and torn. It has an aesthetic sense of rural lifestyle. This condition of Katha combines rural life. Because Katha is the witness of rural life, it is the philosophy of the ultimate truth in which the villagers live. As the particle becomes old, a variety of textures, shapes, form and lines begins to emerging in katha. Its seems as if that want to say something verbally. In emerging figures I give the form of a painting by needle threads with old clothes, some colors and this shape takes the form of my art

My works are the exploration of the gendered self as a self-conscious choice. My works from the 2011's explored diverse materials as metaphors. I negotiate the public and private realm with ease, transcending genres and locating the body as a site of constellation and appropriation. My feminist aesthetics and cutting edge strategies move beyond the confinement of two-dimensionality into a multidisciplinary approach. I use domestic skills to explore an aesthetic way and a craft with contemporary concerns relating to women's labor and life. I have an ability to use material and media with conviction.

I started out as a painter but now I work with sculptural installations and also painting but in a very different way. I am constantly kind of observing and observe from a personal point of view. I observe from finding something that's new or surprising and not everything I find becomes material for a work, but there is a movement when an idea and the material come together. I think it's all the more relevant at this point in India to do what I'm doing things are changing really quickly but I don't think what is happening now is necessarily a positive in fact we are going backwards in many ways .

My art is all about gender and sexuality I'm concentrating mostly about the female form and my work is totally an autobiographical exploration of my own experience. I am very interested in painting, sculpture, Textile, embroidery, fabrics, Installation, performance. In this project I am interested to merge various objects collected from various places in Odisha and with collaboration with some organizations engage in traditional crafts materials.

My stuff in it and also my work seems to have gotten bigger and I m a little bit of a holder. I don't let go of small things or big things which I think might be useful. So having brought something home or to my studio and looking at it doesn't necessarily get fit in my work, it could be that action actually takes me to something else. So these gestures of material locating or looking for one and finding another. All these are certain processes of making or however come about for me the formal concerns of a work is very important. I see it as a big challenge to bring about an idea through formal languages and that is usually underlined by the material that I use also has a different context of its own. I try to either transform the material without changing its identity too much and I try with my own ideas in the large sense of the work so both of them exist side by side. At no point as my work being sculpture in the pure sense it's always been a relationship to space or my relationship to it.


Hemant Rao









Back in my village school in Ghazipur, India, the first green shoots of this magical world called art were sprouting when I was not even aware what art was while doodling on ground with stick, or with chalk on school blackboard, or with scraps of charcoal on the walls of a decrepit abandoned house in the neighbourhood. I was also totally ignorant about formal art education or Art colleges until I left my village for the first time for a city, after finishing school, to look for avenues for higher education. Here a chance encounter with a distant propelled me into formal education into the serious word of art. My journey since then has taken me through experimentation with various forms, shapes, textures, colours and mediums. Starting with charcoal dry-pastel and roting ink, I got a chance to work and paint with water colour and acrylic both on paper and canvas, including working with mix media. I also worked with ink on acrylic sheet, with good results, but lacked funds to scale it up and take such work to the exhibitions. My current works are in water colour or acrylic with ink, drawn on either paper or canvas.

Even though, I painted landscapes and portraits for a while, it is the human forms and relationships which have fascinated me the most. It is possibly the influence from my days in the village, with so much peace and serenity all around and all things moving at a slow leisurely pace, where I got to observe life and the bonds that tie us all so closely. In my earlier works, the figures, including the emotions they exude, flowed as simple shapes, forms and colours on my canvas. As I grew older, my understanding of the universe and relationships within it expanded and so did my canvas. My recent works therefore are a celebration of human existence and relationships within the mystical depths of our cosmos. Inherent in my work is a deep seated feeling of joy and exuberance, represented by these figures, motifs and elements floating freely in space with cheerful abandon. Cosmic energy, represented in my works by seamless unbroken lines, transcends all boundaries in the physical and celestial world. My current works are a manifestation of a cosmic bond tying together all forms and the formless into one intertwined and inter connected organism.

Satyadheer's canvas is that wide open stage where we witness a melodrama of simple joys and desires of a common man being performed in a way that is both fantastic and satirical. Like an adept dramatist, Satyadheer knows very well the art of translating simple narratives of the ordinary contemporary life in epic style. The action is unfolded and our eyes meet with vibrant, delightful scenes combining and contrasting trivial with the grandiloquent, classical and traditional with the modern, popular myth with the present reality, observation with imagination, humour with criticism. This hybrid mixing constitutes the major body of his work and is reflected in the depiction of scenes capturing joyous and romantic moments of fun rides on the hybridized chariots, a medlev of modern vehicle and cart driven/drawn by the transmuted creatures and pleasure trips to the local sights, the most sought after destinations for lovers. These are the common sights where we can meet his protagonists, the common men, who come adorned with both the modern accessories such as cell phones and royal umbrellas that are seen as the mark of superiority. Images synthesized such as this, not only helps the artist explore his themes of life's ordinary experiences and reflect closely-observed realities in a more cheerful manner but also reveal the nuances of past and present cultures with their sociopolitical implications. While Images are rendered in the most imaginative and burlesque way to give a chuckle of delight, they do not lose the grasp of reality. As behind this veil of mirth and jollity there are critical underpinnings of wit and irony as an alternative response to socio-political and economic hierarchies of our present societies. This aspect broadens the thematic framework of his work that one cannot understand in a fixed conceptual meaning. His canvas further widens to encompass the themes of diversity in Indian culture. This is clearly reflected in one of his works titled "Awadh through my eyes" the place known for its composite culture. The work fuses the Hindu-Muslim elements to show the religious harmony between the two religions.

Satyadheer has a unique style of projecting these images. His acrobatically free hand draws figures in a way that is humorous and exaggerated. The stretched and extended limbs with their theatrical gestures are the aspiration of a common man who tries to reach the unattainable. The same sense of freedom can be seen in his compositional structure and application of colours that are invested with intensity and vigor. The eclectic mix of bright colours combined with light regions maintains a balance in opposition and thus heightens the effect of drama. In the same way, spaces are punctuated by contrasting colours to shift one scene to another. This fine sense of sharp contrast in the constant play of life's drama gives viewer an equal measure of delight with the artist.
